WOOD COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING

November 5, 2018

The Wood County Solid Waste Management District Policy Committee met on the 5th day of November 2018. Commissioner Doris Herringshaw called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. The following members were present: Commissioner Herringshaw, Mayor Dick Edwards, Judy Hagen, Lana Glore, Jim Rossow, and Lori Carson. Additional persons were in attendance as listed on the attached roster. The Agenda was as follows:

- I. Approval of May 14, 2018 Meeting Minutes. Jim Rossow moved that the minutes be approved and Lana Glore seconded the motion. All members present voted aye and the motion carried.
- II. Solid Waste Management District Update: Assistant County Administrator Kelly O'Boyle reported on the following:

December 1, 2018 Personal Shredding Event: The Solid Waste Management District, Board of Commissioners, Job & Family Services (JFS), and AllShred are sponsoring the collection which will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the south parking lot of the Wood County Fairgrounds. Up to five boxes or bags of paper per vehicle will be accepted at no cost with a donation of an unwrapped toy or cash to support the children involved with JFS.

Ohio EPA Recycling & Litter Prevention Grants: Community & Litter, Market Development, and Scrap Tire grants are available. The application deadline is February 1, 2019.

2018 Annual District Report: Preparation will begin in December. The deadline for submittal is June 1, 2019.

Permanent 24/7 Mixed Recycling Locations Update: Mrs. O'Boyle presented an update to the Committee (attached). The District has received positive feedback from Republic Services re: quality of recyclables. Community groups and District staff were commended for their assistance in maintaining the sites.

Introduction of Beth Parker: Mrs. O'Boyle introduced Beth Parker, the District's Environmental Program Coordinator. Ms. Parker joined the District on June 26, 2018 and previously worked as a Naturalist for the Wood County Park District.

September Financials: Patti Bowsher presented a report comparing the District's 2014-2018 September year-to-date revenue, expenses, and cash balance (attached).

- III. *Education & Awareness:* Ms. Parker reported on events, the permanent recycling locations, advertising, and education outreach from July through October (attached).
- IV. Landfill/Recycling Updates: The status of glass recycling at downtown businesses in Perrysburg was discussed, with nothing confirmed at this time. The City of Bowling Green will be partnering with BGSU to offer a Recycle Coach mobile app for residents and students, which will include a "what goes where" tool. The City has also initiated a new tracking system for curbside

recyclables taken to the Bowling Green Recycling Center for more efficient capturing of recycling data. The Health Department has employment opportunities for sanitarian positions. Phoenix Technologies has seen an overall downward turn in recycling; community recycling contracts are being renegotiated due to lower values and new requirements for less contamination.

A public hearing was held on August 8 providing information on plans to apply for an expansion permit for the Wood County Landfill. Mrs. O'Boyle has not received any comments from the Ohio EPA regarding the application at this point.

The status of residential recycling in North Baltimore was discussed. The Masons wish to continue providing the drop-off service at a building owned by the Village. Ownership of equipment used at the facility is expected to be finalized, and the operation will continue as is.

Mrs. O'Boyle reported post cards will be mailed to residents who will be served by the new 24/7 permanent drop-off sites in Portage and Wayne. The target date for these locations to accept recyclables is November 15.

- V. Other Business: Committee members agreed to the 2019 proposed meetings dates.

- VII. Adjournment: Mayor Edwards made a motion to adjourn, Judy Hagen seconded, meeting adjourned at 9:05 a.m.





B. Permanent Locations

People have become more familiar with what is and is not accepted in the containers. We have run several ads to educate people about what they can recycle at these locations, including in the Sentinel-Tribune, Harrison Rally Days paper by the Perrysburg Messenger-Journal, and the Grand Rapids Chamber of Commerce calendar.

C. Advertising

Recent advertising has been targeted at promoting awareness about what to recycle at the permanent locations. A holiday themed advertisement for the Household Recycling Guide will appear in the November edition of the AT HOME IN WOOD COUNTY magazine, which is mailed to all 50,000+ Wood County addresses. An ad will also appear in the Sentinel-Tribune promoting the December 1st personal shredding event organized by the BCC, Job and Family Services, SWMD, and Allshred Services.

D. Education Numbers

From June 26th through October 29th, the District has provided 16 tours and 7 presentations. We've also participated in 5 community events. As of October 21st, the website has been visited approximately 53,500 times by 7,000 users. 55% are mobile users. The top pages are: the Landfill page, the Home page, the Household Recycling Guide, and the Brochures page.
